BACKGROUND AND COMMUNITY

The British School, New Delhi, was founded in 1963. It is a not-for-profit day school with an international student population of about 60 nationalities. Approximately 640 students are enrolled in classes from Nursery to Year 13.

The Cambridge International Examinations (CIE), Edexcel, International Baccalaureate Organisation (IBO), Council of International Schools (CIS) accredited member.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Year 10–11

- ◆ 6 IGCSE certificates or more
- ◆ Successful completion of Community Service Programme in Year 11
- ◆ A minimum of 90% attendance
- ◆ Students need to attain at least five C's in IGCSE examination or equivalent at the end of the Year 11

Year 12–13

- ◆ At least 6 IB courses at Standard Level (SL) or 5 IB courses- 4 at SL and at least one 1 at Higher Level (HL)
- ◆ Theory of Knowledge in the first year of the programme

Note: The British School Diploma is a four year programme, though many international and local students sometimes join us at the beginning of Year 12 for the final two years. They come with a variety of different qualifications; the Coordinators and School Counsellors meet with the students individually and plan the students' courses to help them complete the graduation requirements.

CURRICULUM

Students follow the National Curriculum of England from Nursery to Key Stage 3 (Year 7, 8 & 9). In Secondary School (Years 10 – 13) all students are required to pursue The British School Diploma, which is earned at the end of Year 13. Integrated into this curriculum are courses that also prepare students for external examinations (Cambridge International Examinations and Edexcel) in the IGCSE Programme (Years 10 & 11) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (Years 12 & 13). There are 38 students in our graduating class (Year 13) this year and 61 (Year 12) students to whom we offer 40 IB subject options.

- ◆ Successful completion of Community service and Extra Curricular requirement – 150 hours
- ◆ Successful completion of the Work Experience Programme in Year 12
- ◆ A minimum of 90% attendance
- ◆ Students take the following subjects:
 - English
 - Mathematics
 - 1 or 2 Sciences
 - 1 or 2 Social Sciences
 - A Modern Foreign Language or Art or Theatre Studies or Computer Science
- ◆ Students need to attain at least a Level 3 in each subject and not less than one Level 2 at the end of the programme

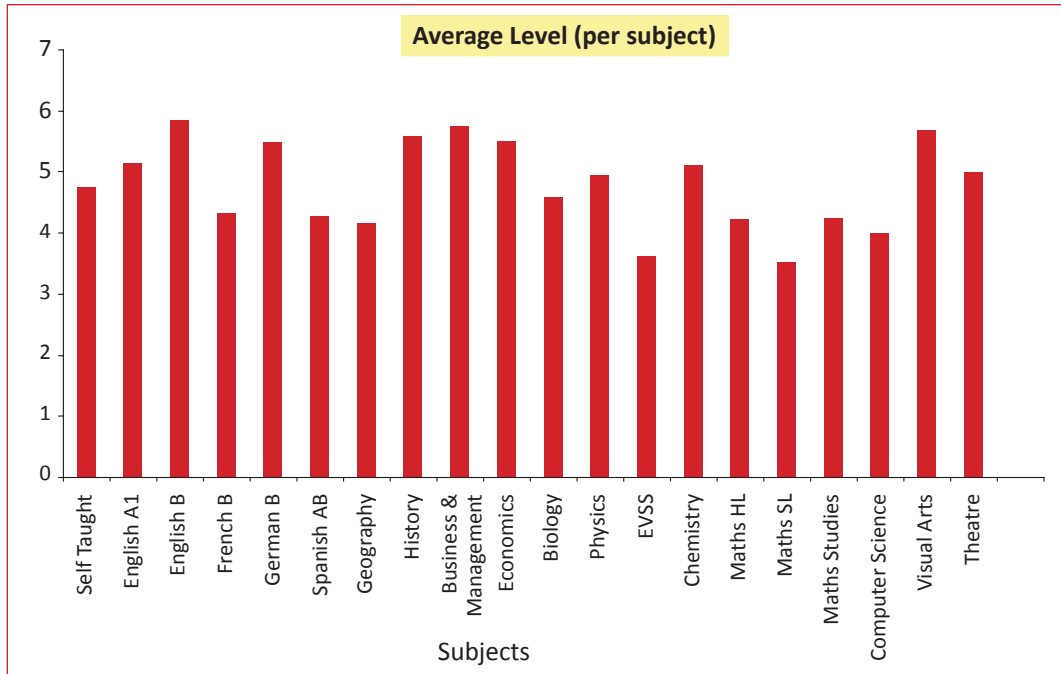

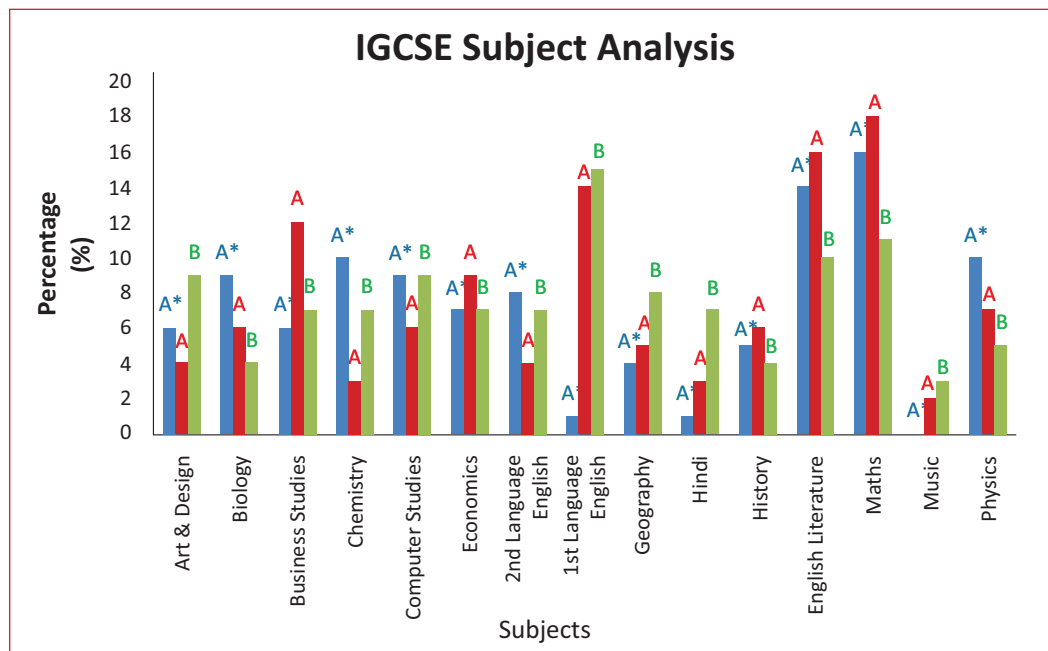
